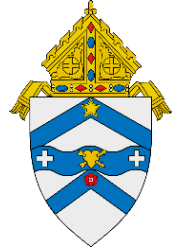

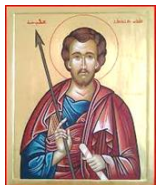

FEAST OF ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE

July 3

St. Thomas is known for his doubts about the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Doubts, which turned into a lively faith, when upon seeing and touching the wounds of Christ he exclaimed “My Lord and my God!” We can see from the passage in the Gospel of John (John 20:24-29) that while the Lord allowed St. Thomas to have persistent doubts, He did not abandon him in his doubt.

St. Thomas’s faith and courage became a hallmark of his missionary travels after Pentecost. Tradition has it that he preached in Syria, Persia, and finally southern India – the latter two areas outside of the Roman Empire and removed from all that would be familiar to St. Thomas. After he had converted numerous tribes to Christianity in southern India, Hindu priests put him to death with lances.

THE REAL PRESENCE OF CHRIST IN THE EUCHARIST

The **Real Presence** of Christ in the Eucharist is the Christian doctrine that Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist, not merely symbolically or metaphorically, but in a true, real and substantial way... The doctrine of the Real Presence asserts that in the Holy Eucharist **Jesus is literally and wholly present—body and blood, soul and divinity—under the appearances of bread and wine.** Many Protestants attack this doctrine as “unbiblical,” but the Bible is forthright in declaring it (cf. 1 Cor. 10:16–17, 11:23–29; and, most forcefully, John 6:32–71).
